100th Anniversary of the Sunrise Theatert Congratulation to the Sunrise Theater on their 100th Anniversary. The Sunrise Theater has a very unique history and has been a part of the City of Fort Pierce since the "roaring twenties." The Sunrise Theater website states: "Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the Sunrise opened its doors on August 1, 1923 as the largest theatre on Florida's East Coast between

Jacksonville and Miami. It quickly became the center of all St. Lucie County's cultural activities. The theatre closed its doors on September 8, 1983, due to the decline of the downtown area and a refusal to convert to multi-screen operation. In 1988, Main Street Fort Pierre was established and soon realized the need for the Sunrise Theater as a center for local, national and international world class performing arts presentations. Main Street Fort Pierre began an effort to save the historic theatre. In 1997, the Sunrise Theater was purchased by the St. Lucie Preservation Association Inc., and today, after reopening on January 6, 2006, the theatre is completely renovated to its original splendor with state-of-the-art sound and lighting systems and is sowned and operated by the City of Fort Pierce."
